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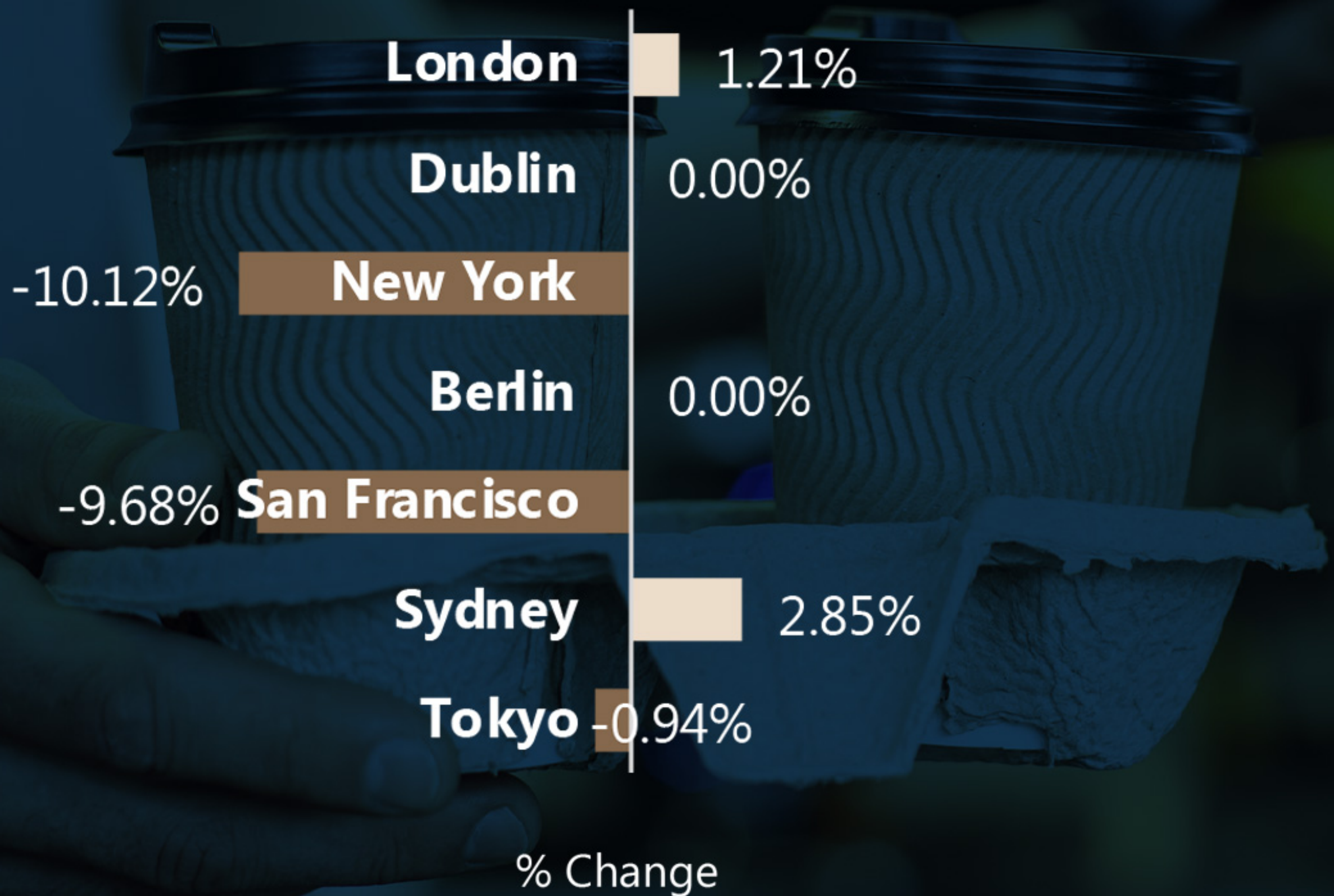
How Prices Have Changed Since Q1

The Latte Index Q2 2026

**Dublin** €5.65 0%  
v Q1 2026

In Q2 2026, Dublin is unchanged at €5.65 and continues to sit firmly among the highest-cost markets.

**London €6.00 +1.21%**  
v Q1 2026

In Q2 2026, London remains the most expensive city for a latte at €6.00, increasing slightly from €5.93 in Q1.

**New York** €5.03 -10.12%  
v Q1 2026

New York falls to €5.03 (from €5.60), with the underlying price decreasing from \$6.55 to \$5.85.

**San Francisco €4.51 -9.68%**  
v Q1 2026

San Francisco shows a similar pattern, dropping to €4.51 from €5.00, alongside a decline in local pricing from \$5.85 to \$5.25.

**Berlin** €4.90 0%  
v Q1 2026

**Sydney** €4.58 +2.85%  
v Q1 2026

**Tokyo** €3.44 -0.94%  
v Q1 2026

Berlin is unchanged at €4.90, while Sydney increases modestly to €4.58. Tokyo remains the lowest-priced city at €3.44, with only a slight decrease quarter-on-quarter.
